

FS have enjoyed re-telling the story of The Little Red Hen. They also did lots of counting, especially of the characters and items in the story.

Children in Year 1 have been thinking about writing for a purpose to share information. They read and wrote invitations making sure information was clear.

In Yellow Class the children learnt how to use bar modelling to help them represent their mathematical thinking and support their calculations.

Year 3 wrote some very detailed non-chronological reports following their visit to Colchester Castle. They took time to draft and edit their work with their friends.

Year 4 are really enjoying their music lessons with Mrs White. They are becoming more fluent when playing the recorder and are developing a sense of musicality.

In Year 5 this week everyone learnt about completing two step problems in mathematics. They needed to interpret the question and work out the most efficient method.

Year 6 have been using fractions in a range of different calculations. They have been reminding themselves how to add, subtract, multiply and divide accurately.
