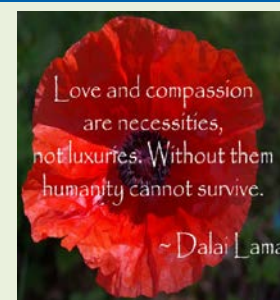
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## Remembrance

Red class have been learning about 2D shapes this week, and made dinosaurs using squares, triangles, circles, half-circles, and rectangles.
