Autism Awareness

This week has been Autism Awareness Week. Autism is a lifelong disability which affects how people communicate and interact with the world. Autism is much more common than most people think. There are approximately 700,000 autistic adults and children in the UK. Autistic people see, hear and feel the world differently to other people. All autistic people share certain difficulties, but being autistic will affect them in different ways. Some autistic people say the world feels overwhelming and this can cause them considerable anxiety. In particular, understanding and relating to other people, and taking part in everyday family, school, work and social life, can be harder. Other people appear to know, intuitively, how to communicate and interact with each other, yet can also struggle to build rapport with autistic people. Autistic people

may wonder why they are 'different' and feel their social differences mean people don't understand them. Some parents of autistic children say that other people simply think their child is naughty, while adults find that they are misunderstood. In assembly this week we shared the story Sam and the Spider by Genevieve Yusuf, it is a wonderful story of friendship and kindness.
