Whilst working on London and New Year scenes this week, Foundation Stage used Numicon to add together and create their own buildings, like Big Ben!

Year 1 have been learning about adding two amounts together. The children used tens frames and number lines to count on from one number and find the correct total.

Year 2 have been looking at Atlases this week. They talked about the temperatures of countries and where they are, and where THEY would like to visit and what to bring.
