












Dear Parents and Carers,

As we get closer to the end of this academic year, we wanted to make sure you had information on next academic year. With the exception of Foundation Stage, all pupils will return on Thursday 2^{nd} September. Foundation Stage will begin on Monday 6^{th} September.

- **Drop off will be 8:50am** for all pupils on the recreation ground. For the first week, all children will be met on the playground by the teacher. After the first full week, pupils in Key Stage 1 and Foundation Stage will continue to be met on the playground, and pupils in Key Stage 2 will head straight to their class.
- **Collection will be at 3:15pm** for all pupils. We have really missed having families on site, and are hopeful this will be able to be via the playground for all Year Groups.
- **Foundation Stage will drop off their child at 9am and collect them at 12pm** on the recreation ground from Monday 6th September to Friday 10th September. After their first week, drop off and collection will be as above.
- The vast majority of children still do not need to bring bags to school. Spare clothes can be added to their PE kits, and water bottles and packed lunch boxes can be carried. However if your child needs a bag for medical supplies or to carry additional work etc on a given day, that's no problem.

Depending on the current guidance, we will look to slowly reintroduce other aspects of the school environment that have been altered during the last 18 months. We are very conscious of just how much change children have had to go through, and that for the younger pupils this is the only way they have experienced a school day. Whilst we are very much looking forward to children being able to socialise with each other during playtime etc, we will make sure changes are made sensitively, and safely.

This is not exhaustive but we hope you understand why we have decided to take it slowly and not set things in stone so many weeks ahead of next academic year. We will miss you all and can't wait to see you all and meet our new friends in Foundation Stage in September.
